

#### HORSE REGULATIONS

# • Entries close Wednesday 19<sup>th</sup> March 2025 – NO ENTRIES ON THE DAY!

#### MANDATORY FEES

- Class Pre-Entry Fee \$8 per class
- Ground Fee per horse \$10 per horse

#### HAY AND MANURE

 Fletcher Park is a Flora and Fauna reserve. Hay & manure <u>MUST</u> be taken home OR placed in receptacle at top of bays.

#### **CAMPING FEES**

- \$10 per person
- Please indicate on the entry form if you require camping on Saturday afternoon/evening October 19.

#### MANDATORY FORMS

- Exhibitor Waiver (waiver to be sent in with pre-entries or provided at secretary office when entering on the day)
- Copy of Horse Registration & Memberships (sent in with pre-entries or provided at secretary office when entering on the day)
- Event Facility Fee: All competitors must pay the compulsory, non-refundable event facility fee of \$10 per horse at the time of entry.
- AHHA Membership form if a new member
- Proof of payment

#### **CONDITIONS and SHOW RULES**

- There is <u>NO</u> entries on the day, Pre-Entries only
- All horse or ponies must wear a number that is clear and visible to our stewards. Numbers will be issued by the AHHA in an email once entries are processed
- Junior competitors in the harness classes MUST wear an approved safety helmet
- Organiser reserves the right to measure an exhibit should a dispute arise
- Stallion/colts must be bitted/restrained under adult supervision at all times (persons over 17yrs). Failure to do so may result in being asked to leave
- For led classes, all handlers are required to wear closed toe shoes covering the top of the foot. Failure to do so may result in you being asked to leave the ring. While mounted, all competitors must wear regulation safety helmet and riding boots. Any competitor not adhering to this regulation will be asked to dismount from horse/pony immediately
- The committee reserves the right to reject or refuse any competitor entry
- No Exhibitor, owner or spectators shall be permitted to be with the Stewards or Judges during the time of judging the exhibits, unless by special request of the Stewards. Exhibitors in any particular section are not permitted to act as stewards for that section. Competitors should not address the judge by name. All contact from competitor to the judge should be conducted through the steward
- <u>The judge's decision is final</u>. Protests must be lodged with the Chief Steward of the applicable horse section with a \$50 deposit within 30 minutes after the class
- All horses will be judged under their official breed standard and should be presented correctly for their breed
- Cruelty to, or the abuse of any animal, by any person at this event is forbidden and an offender may be subject to withdrawal from further event classes
- The Judges may award a 2nd or 3rd prize instead of 1st prize or may withhold a prize altogether where there is only one exhibit, or where the exhibits are not considered worthy. Judge's decision is final
- All horses must compete drug free
- An Exhibitor showing an animal which appears unsound, or showing signs of lameness, exhaustion or distress may be asked to withdraw immediately from further competition
- Horses may not be left tied up and unattended
- All competitors and their associates must behave in an appropriate manner towards judges, stewards, show
  organisers and other competitors at all times during the event. Abusive behaviour will not be tolerated. Any
  inappropriate behaviour reported by judges or stewards and/or witnessed by a member of the organising committee
  may result in elimination from the event, without refund, and banned from any future events within the AHHA
- Championships: Winners of Champions in Open rings must not compete in the same events in the other rings
- Age of Horses: The age of horses will date from 1st August.
- Age of Competitors: Taken on the day of the event

- **Breed Events:** Competitors entering breed events must be current financial members of the AHHA. Horses must be properly registered with the applicable breed society(s). Proof of registration & current membership must be included with entry and may be requested on the day. Spot checks may be undertaken. Competitors found to be non-compliant with this rule may be disqualified from the event, without refund
- No refund on entry fees, facility fee
- All competitors enter at their own risk
- Competitors must remove horse manure and leave the grounds in a tidy manner. Please remove any manure, rubbish and excess hay from your surrounding area
- The AHHA is not responsible for any damage or loss of property
- No dogs are permitted on the grounds unless they are on a leash at ALL TIMES!
- Splitting Classes: The Horse Committee will determine if classes are to be split. The decision to split classes will be made on the day of the show, based on number of entries and class sizes
- Fletcher Park is a Flora and Fauna reserve and Wallangarra Horse & Pony Club is A SMOKE FREE venue. No one is permitted to smoke on the premises. If you do want to smoke, then you need to exit via the entry gate and when finished please take your cigarette butts with you and place in a bin.


#### PHOTOGRAPHERS

#### Judge One:

### Sue-Ellen Kiesling

Sue-Ellen's start into horses was way more years ago than she will admit to. It all started with a Welsh Mountain pony and over the years, she has seen a lot of different breeds and types owned, bred, produced and shown. Sue-Ellen was introduced to Heavy Horses when asked to assist a friend at the Heavy Horse Festival at Gatton. This event started her on the quest to learn more and she eventually sat the exam to become a Clydesdale panel state judge. Sue-Ellen thinks that amongst the many achievements over the years, some of her proudest moments were when her home bred horses won at national level under international judges. According to Sue-Ellen, a standout horse is the one that meets the breed standard and you can see what it is without guessing. Type and correct conformation are paramount. She also believes that a horse who has correct conformation should be able to move well and be sound.



### Judge Two:

#### **Bayley Thomas**

Bayley has been judging for 20 years and is a qualified State Level Show Horse judge as well as a qualified riding coach. She has judged just about every breed in Australia over the years including State Championship events. Bayley has personally been heavily involved in Friesian Warmbloods (part bred heavy horses!) showing them to several *Horse of the Year* wins both in halter and under saddle including with horses she has bred herself. She still has 3 Friesian Warmbloods in her care and very partial to a lovely heavy horse. Bayley has a long history in different breeds and types of horses and now personally breeds and competes Warmbloods and enjoys her little team of Australian Riding Ponies. She has recently 'retired' from retraining and rehoming Standardbreds after being involved with them since childhood.

**Under 18 years old**. The horse/s can either be harnessed in winkers, long reins, collar, hames, backband (optional) and trace chains, spider harness **OR** just long reins and bridle.

#### 33. Heavy Horse Long Rein - Beginner Driver

Open only to those competitors who have **NOT** won a 1st place ribbon in a beginner long rein class. If placed 2<sup>nd</sup> or fewer competitors in past classes, then this does not apply.

The horse/s can either be harnessed in winkers, long reins, collar, hames, backband (optional) and trace chains, spider harness **OR** long reins and harness.

#### 34. Heavy Horse Open Long Rein Driver (18yrs and over)

The horse/s can either be harnessed in winkers, long reins, collar, hames, backband (optional) and trace chains, spider harness **OR** just long reins and bridle. **Cannot compete in beginner** 

#### 35. Heavy Horse Long Rein - Beginner Horse

Horse has never won a first place at a working show. The horse/s can either be harnessed in winkers, long reins, collar, hames, backband (optional) and trace chains, spider harness **OR** just long reins and bridle.

#### 36. Heavy Horse Long Rein - Open Horse

The horse/s can either be harnessed in winkers, long reins, collar, hames, backband (optional) and trace chains, spider harness **OR** just long reins and bridle. **Cannot compete in beginner horse as well.** 

#### 37. Heavy Horse Led Horse - Led Obstacle Course (horse any age)

This event is open to any horses. The horse must be in a halter and lead and entire male horses over 12 months must have a bit in their mouth. A show cane or similar may be used to help guide your horse, but the cane must not exceed 1.2m in length. *Using the cane to hit the horse will result in immediate disqualification.* 

Points will be lost if the horse refuses any part of the course or if any part of the course is knocked or eaten. This is a timed event around an obstacle course and penalties per fault apply. A clear round without penalties will beat a timed round with penalties. This is a horsemanship class not a speed event, but a total time limit on the course may be set.

#### 38. Heavy Horse Long Rein - Junior Driver Obstacle

A competitor must be 17 years and under on the first day of competition. Proof of age may be required. All competitors must be closely attended by an adult at all times whilst competing. This adult must be a competent horse handler. Competitors shall negotiate obstacle courses as directed by the Judge.

Penalties are incurred for mistakes or if Junior is assisted in any way by the adult. The horse must be driven at a walk, trotting will incur penalties, except in a wheeled vehicle and cantering will result in disqualification.

#### 39. Heavy Horse Long Rein - Driving Obstacle Course

The horse/s can either be harnessed in winkers, long reins, collar, hames, backband (optional) and trace chains, spider harness **OR** long reins and harness. Competitors shall negotiate obstacle courses as directed by the judge.

Points will be lost if the horse or harness touch any part of the course. The course must be driven from the ground, while walking beside or behind the horse. Any break into a trot will be penalised, a break into canter or gallop will be disqualified. Shouting and whipping is not allowed. This is a timed event and penalties per fault apply. A clear round without penalties will beat a timed round with penalties. Fewest faults within a given time is the priority.

#### 40. Cone Driving Obstacle course

Cone driving is open to all heavy and light horses and ponies in long rein driving.

**Cone knock down** = 5 Second Penalty, **Missing a Cone set or entering via the reverse side** = 5 Second Penalty, **Failing to pass through the start/finish** = 5 Second Penalty. Cones width will be 190 cm. There are no exclusions, except where there is a safety or welfare issue identified by the judge.

Only for riders who are either **NEW** to riding, recently started riding, coming back after a confidence crushing event **or** are beginner/nervous riders (there is **NO** pressure to Canter)

- **1.** 18 25 Years
- **2.** 26 34 Years
- 3. 35 Years and Over

#### 42. In Hand Dressage (Walk-Trot)

Introduce the horse to in-hand work in the competition Arena. Show the horse's obedience, willingness to go forward and with ease into the contact of the handler. To be guided correctly around the geometry of the arena with a soft contact and correct bend. Halters (web or rope) with lead or bridle with snaffle bit are to be used. There are marks for presentation, which includes the handler as well as the horse. A colourful roller blanket will add to this impression. No leg wraps or bandages permitted.

#### 43. Costume/Fancy Dress

- 1. Kids Led Creative Costume (Kid and horse combination)
- 2. Led Creative Costume (Handler and horse combination)
- 3. Mounted Creative Costume (Rider and horse combination)

#### 44. Hobby Horse

Hobby horsing allows enthusiasts to act out their fantasies of owning, riding, and competing with their own horse, minus the high expenses. And minus cleaning up piles of dung! Another reason behind its popularity is the community. Hobby-horses are known to be very supportive of each other, even in tournaments. Everyone's accepted the way they are. And then there's the final and most important reason: **IT'S JUST GOOD FUN!** 

- 1. Junior 12 years & under
- 2. Teens 13 to 17 years
- 3. Seniors 18 to 34 years

#### Costume/Fancy Dress Information:

**Kids Led Creative** – Kid must be mounted on the horse with handler leading. Only horse and kid are to be in a creative costume.

Led Creative – Handler must lead the horse from the ground. Both horse and hander are to be in a creative costume.

**Mounted Creative** - Rider must be mounted on the horse as this is a ridden class. Both horse and hander are to be in a creative costume. There cannot be a handler on the ground walking the horse.

#### Hobby Horse Information:

Hobby horse competitions typically involve participants performing routines and movements with their hobby horses, which can include dressage-like performances, jumping over obstacles, freestyle performances, and more. Judges assess the participants based on their technique, execution, style, creativity, and overall performance.

Horse sports are dangerous recreational activities and horses can act in a sudden and unpredictable way, especially when frightened or hurt.

#### By signing this waiver, I acknowledge that:

- 1. participation in horse sports is a hazardous activity and may result in injury, loss, damage or death to me
- 2. participation in horse sports requires certain skills. I declare that I have sufficient skills to be able to safely and properly participate in the events
- 3. horses can act in a sudden and unpredictable way, especially if frightened or hurt, or if exposed to loud or unfamiliar noises
- 4. if held at an agricultural show, the horse sports will be held in close proximity to rides and large groups of people, and that there may be loud and unfamiliar noises which can frighten horses
- 5. as the event is held outdoors, there are risks to me and to my horse as a result of the weather conditions, including either extreme hot or cold weather, rain or wind

- 7. there is inherent in horse riding events the risk of suffering injury including falling from my horse
- 8. I am responsible for ensuring that I have and will wear equipment suitable for safely and properly participating in the event; and
- 9. I use the facilities of this event entirely at my own risk, as I find them and with the prior acceptance of the risk of possible danger to me
  - 9.1 If I suffer harm while participating in a horse event, I will not hold the Suppliers, their employees or agents legally responsible for any injuries I suffer. I will not sue the Suppliers, their employees or agents for any claims, costs, damages or liability.
